Chairman Sammons called the meeting to order.

Commissioner Callaway made a motion and seconded by Commissioner Brooks to add discussion of the Exit 29 Rezoning to the Agenda. Motion approved 4-0. Commissioner Harvey was not present for the vote.

After a short discussion concerning the impact the rezoning would have on the residential properties in the area and the fact that with conditional use the wastewater treatment plant's current designation of general residential and forest agriculture is acceptable, Commissioner Callaway requested that the Board reconsider its September 16, 2010 decision and rescind the BeSeen Outdoor, Inc. contract and withdraw its zoning request.

Motion made by Commissioner Callaway and seconded by Commissioner Coleman to rescind the September 16, 2010 action to submit an application request to Glynn County to rezone the Exit 29 WWTP parcels of land to General Commercial, and rescind approval of the Agreement with BeSeen Outdoor, Inc. Motion Approved 5-0.
